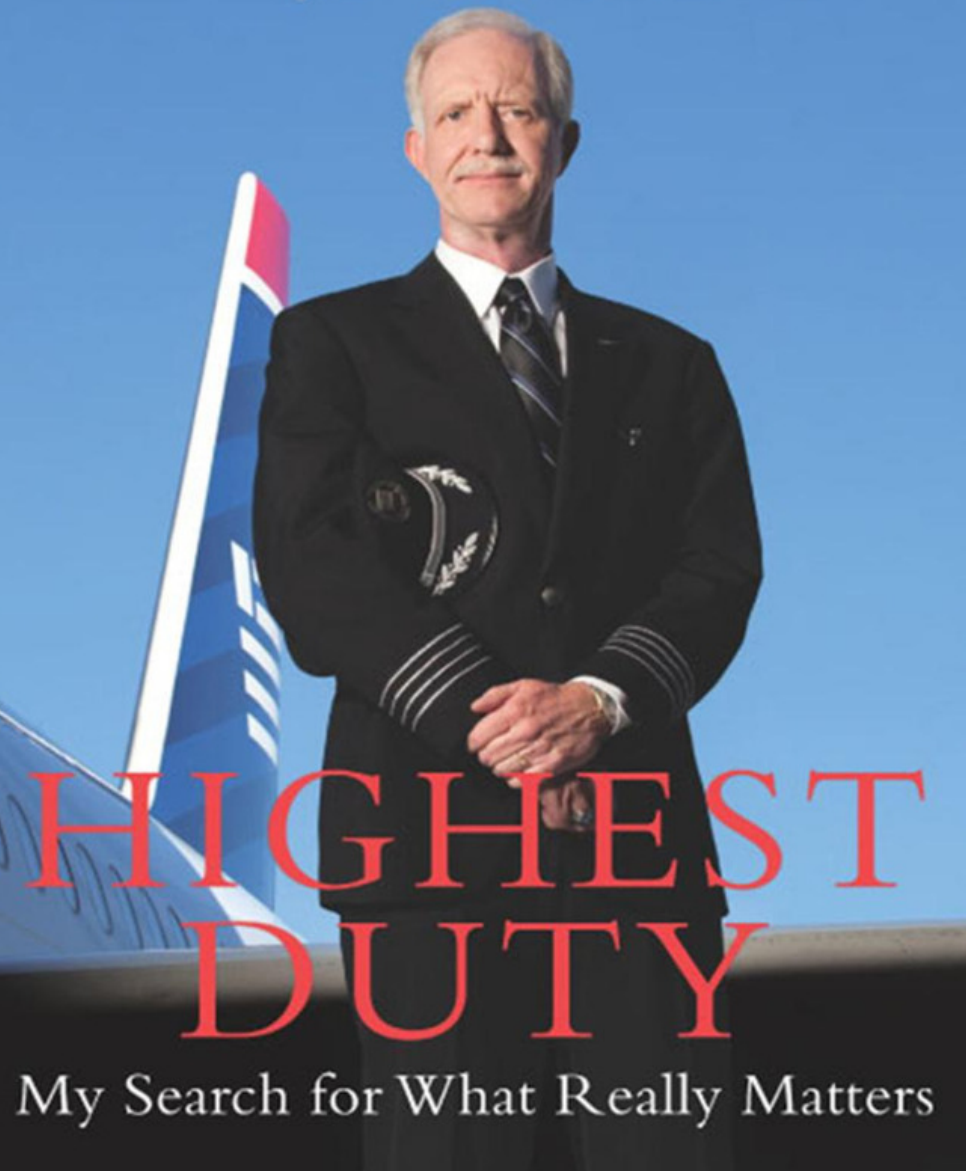

He is a member and past chair of the Division for Communication and the Future of the National Communication Association, and is a Trustee of the Institute of General Semantics, a member of the Board of Directors of the Media Ecology Association, and a member of the Board of Trustees of the School of Applied Theology of the Berkeley Graduate Theology Union.
