Ed Tywoniak is Associate Professor of Communication and Chair of the department of Communication at Saint Mary's College of California, where he has served on the faculty in the School of Liberal Arts for over 30 years. Professor Tywoniak also holds the position of Faculty Fellow for Curriculum and Technology, and is Senior Research Fellow and Director of the W.M. Keck Digital Culture Research Lab. Dr. Tywoniak completed undergraduate studies at Saint Mary's in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology. He went on to earn an MFA in Electronic Music Composition from the Center for Contemporary Music at Mills College, and a doctorate in Educational Leadership at Technology from the Institute for Catholic Educational Leadership at the University of San Francisco. He is a member and past chair of the Division for Communication and the Future of the National Communication Association, and is a Trustee of the Institute of General Semantics, a member of the Board of Directors of the Media Ecology Association, and a member of the Board of Trustees of the School of Applied Theology of the Berkeley Graduate Theology Union.

ABOUT THE BOOK:

A Pulitzer Prize-winning masterpiece in a gripping, yet heart-wrenching, and wholly remarkable tale of coming-of-age in a South poisoned by virulent prejudice.
